JOB SUMMARY:

The City of Hampton is accepting applications for a full-time Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator. This position is responsible for the operation, maintenance, and repair of the City's wastewater treatment plant.

POSITION CONTEXT:

While performing the duties of this job, the employee may be required to sit, stand, talk, and operate multiple types of equipment in varying degrees of temperature for an extended period of time.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Performs inspection, operation, and maintenance of lift stations, electrical controls, pumps, odor scrubbing devices, and valves to ensure proper operations; records pump run times and flow totals; checks calibration of pH and gas meters associated with order scrubber equipment; inspects and adjusts operation of chemical feed pumps and lines;
- Performs scheduled preventive maintenance on motors and pumps; inspects operation of chlorination
 equipment; performs general cleaning/maintenance/repair tasks necessary to keep equipment and
 tools in safe/operable condition; reporting problem situations to immediate supervisor in a timely
 manner;
- Controls wastewater treatment plant operations in accordance with all established regulations, standards, and procedures;
- Prepares and completes various forms, reports, correspondence, logs, and other documents;
- Maintains a comprehensive, current knowledge of applicable laws/regulations; maintaining an awareness of new methods, trends, and advances in the profession of wastewater treatment;
- Performs necessary sampling and tests to ensure compliance with federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and Environmental Protection Division (EPD);
- Performs other related duties as assigned.
